

WHAT YOUR CHILD WILL NEED FOR SCHOOL

School Uniform

Available from Uniform Shop at Peachester State School

If your child is unable to do shoe laces as yet, please consider Velcro shoes. It is very stressful for little people who want to go and play and haven't developed this skill yet.



- Yellow Uniform Shirt
- Sports Shirt (Coochin or Stanley)
- Black shorts/skort
- \circ School hat
- Option: Peachester branded socks available)



- Plain black socks
- Black shoes (sneakers)

It is an expectation of our School Community that ALL children will wear our school uniform. This includes the correct shirt, black shorts/skirts, black socks and black shoes. Wearing the school uniform fosters a sense of school pride and also serves safety and identification purposes.



Our uniform is comfortable and cool, long-lasting, stylish and easy to care for. Uniforms are sold by the P&C at cost, and are available for sale by contacting the P&C.

Please note that the uniform includes both a wide-brimmed black hat or a bucket hat for all students.



Lunch Box

☺ Labelled lunch box

Please spend time with your child over the holidays, making sure they know how to open and close their lunch box and water bottle. You might like to pack their lunch in it some days, so they get used to 'rationing' all of their food for the 3 breaks.

- Brain Break a piece of fruit or vegetable or a yoghurt;
- 1st Break this is the main lunch, where students are encouraged to eat their sandwich/wrap or other main lunch component;
- o 2nd Break this can be a more snack-like option for afternoon tea;
- In summer months, it is a good idea to include a small ice brick to keep lunches fresh.
- ** Students who catch the bus should bring a snack to eat after school while they are waiting.
- ☺ Labelled water bottle

TIPS:

- Please consider carefully the foods you include in your child's lunchbox. We Encourage children to make healthy choices; to eat first and leave the 'treats' for later.

- Containers need to be easy to open, food should not need reheating or cutting up and spoons need to be included so that your child can independently manage their food.

School bag

- School bags should be big enough to hold a lunch box, water bottle, library bag, spare clothes (see below!) and a jumper.
- The Uniform Shop does have School bags for sale. The Harlequin School Bags are extremely durable and come with an amazing warranty. Investing in a quality bag could see your child through their Primary Schooling.



Spare clothes

A spare set of clothes/underwear (in a named plastic bag, kept in school bag). Sometimes our young learners get so engrossed in playing with their friends that they forget about going to the toilet. Accidents happen and it is best to be prepared.

Library Bag

Ubrary bags should be named and large enough to hold children's books that your child will borrow each week.

NAMES AND LABELS

As children sometimes do not recognise their own belongings, we cannot emphasise enough the need to label absolutely everything – bags, shoes, lunchboxes, hats, library bags and clothing.

This includes socks and shoes.

Imagine 24 pairs of socks around our sandpit and trying to find the 5-year-old that owns each one!



SCHOOL TIMES

Parents/Carers are requested not to send students to school prior to 8:30am. Please see contact details for **Helping Hands** for before and after school care.

After school, children should leave the school grounds as soon as practical. Staff supervision is provided for students catching buses. All other children require Parents/Carers supervision. Students are not permitted to play on playground equipment after school.

ARRIVAL PROCEDURE

Prep parents/carers are welcome to take their children directly to the classroom. When children come into the classroom, they are expected to be responsible for their own belongings.

This routine may include:

- © On arrival, the student will put their bag on the bag rack or on a hanging hook outside the classroom.
- The students put their water bottle in the baskets provided.
- © Later on in the year, your child will also place their home reading folder in the box.



The students are then able to choose from the many activities that are set up around the room. You are welcome to play with them if they need some reassurance from you. (If you need to leave and your child is going to have difficulty with separating, just motion towards a staff member, we are happy to come and assist in this process).



When the bell rings at 8:45am, it is a chance for our students to go to the bathroom and get ready for the morning activities.

COLLECTION TIME



Parents and Carers are welcome to wait in the Undercover Area until the 3pm bell sounds.

As you make your way to our classroom door, we will send your child directly to you.

Prep students can be collected by a parent, caregiver or older sibling, but Prep students are not able to leave until we spot the person collecting the child.

PUNCTUALITY

Classes commence promptly at 8:50am so please ensure that your child is at school on time. This way, your child does not miss out on any valuable group learning experiences.

At the end of the school day, please make sure that whoever is collecting your child is here on time. A child can quickly become distressed when it is time to go and no-one is here to collect him/her.

In addition, teachers may have meetings to attend, appointments, etc. and cannot always be there to supervise late into the afternoon.

PREP OPEN MORNINGS

Throughout Terms 3 and 4, the Prep Open Mornings provide an opportunity for parents/carers and future prep students to come and experience our school and participate in class sessions.

During the interview session at the Prep Open morning, parents will be able to discuss any specific issues concerning their child.

The Principal is more than happy to meet with prospective parents and students by arrangement.



SHARING INFORMATION

Events in family life, such as a major illness; visits by grandparents or other relatives; an accident or death of relatives, friends or pets can impact greatly upon children and may markedly affect their behaviour.

It is important for home and the school to share information which may affect your child. We would be most grateful if parents/carers would inform the teacher of any unusual happenings. Send a message to the school mobile, have a quick chat to Admin, make a time to see the teachers or pop a note into their homework folder.

TREASURES FROM HOME

Toys and trinkets from home very often become lost or broken at school, so it saves a lot of time and heartache if these are left at home.

Any toys that find their way to school will be cared for in the office or classroom until the end of the day. Staff cannot assume responsibility for any loss or breakage. Parents will be notified of "show and tell" days.



BIRTHDAYS AND OTHER CELEBRATIONS

Birthdays and other special celebrations are wonderful ways to build relationships with one another. From past experience, we have found that patty cakes are more practical to share than large birthday cakes. However, whichever you choose, please ensure there is enough for everyone in your child's classroom.



There are some students with diet requirements. Please check with staff to make sure that everyone will be safe.



A very popular alternative is a 'Birthday Bucket', which can be organised through our Tuckshop. Simply place your order a week ahead of time and a bucket of iceblocks will be delivered to your child's classroom.

FIRST DAY

On Monday 22 January 2024, there will be a miriad of feeling and emotions for you and your new Prep student.

What do we do?

- © Arrive at school at approximately 8:30am.
- Prep students will need some extra help on their first day. Assist your child to find his/her name on the table and assist your child to put on his/her name tag.
- Sou may sit and play with your child until the teacher indicates it is time to start.
- Say your goodbyes and reassure your child that you will be coming back to get him/her in the afternoon.
- It is best to cheerfully say goodbye and quickly leave rather than dragging out the parting process.
